Risk is worked out using numbers 1 - 5. The likelihood is given a number and this is multiplied by the number given to the severity of the risk.

The result = the risk factor. This generic risk assessment is brief and we have our own individual assessments for each individual risk. A Risk Score of 10 or greater would give serious cause for concern & we would take active and immediate measures where possible to lower the score. If this was not possible we would not be able to inflate the unit. It is recommended that clients undertake their own risk assessment to suit their requirements.

**Responsible person supervising**= This refers to the adult named on the signed hire agreement. Should the inflatable be used in a public area, it is the hirer's responsibility to ensure the supervision of the unit(s) are properly managed.

The **Risk Assessment** above and The **HIRE AGREEMENT** outlines the **Responsible person supervising's** responsibilities during the hire of a Bounce-A-Roo inflatable.
